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1. INTRODUCTION

This HDMI over Fiber Receiver is designed to extend your 4K UHD HDMI signal using a single segment of multi-mode optical fiber cable. Using fiber optical cable provides many advantages over traditional copper-based extension methods, including immunity to RF and magnetic interference, thinner and lighter cables, and much longer extension distances (up to 300 meters per segment). Multiple fiber Transceiver units can be placed between the Transmitter and Receiver to greatly extend the total extension distance via cascading (up to 300 additional meters per Transceiver) if the extra distance or flexibility is desired.

The HDMI input and output of this unit supports resolutions up to 4K@60Hz (4:4:4, 8-bit), 10/12-bit HDR, 16-bit Deep Color up to 1080p@60Hz, HD audio formats and other features defined by the HDMI 2.0 specification. The fiber input of this unit supports sources with bandwidth up to 10.2Gbps (4K@30Hz or 4K@60Hz, YUV 4:2:0). Six pre-defined internal EDIDs, one external EDID selection and two User uploaded EDIDs are available for EDID management. The unit provides intuitive front panel controls as well as RS-232, Telnet and WebGUI control options.

4. SYSTEM REQUIREMENTS

- HDMI source equipment such as a media player, video game console or set-top box.
- HDMI receiving equipment such as an HDTV, monitor or audio amplifier.
- The use of "Premium High Speed HDMI" cables is highly recommended.
- Use of the optical fiber input requires a compatible fiber Transmitter or Transceiver and appropriate paired LC multi-mode fiber in a crossover configuration.




6. OPERATION CONTROLS AND FUNCTIONS

6.1 Front Panel



- 1 SERVICE: This slot is reserved for firmware update use only.
- **2 POWER LED:** This LED will illuminate to indicate the unit is on and receiving power.
- 3 IN Button & LEDs: Press this button to sequentially switch through both inputs and mute. The LED will illuminate solid to indicate which source is currently selected. When both LEDs are blinking, the output is muted.

6.2 Rear Panel



- 1 HDMI OUT: Connect to an HDMI TV, monitor or amplifier for digital video and audio output.
- 2 HDMI 1 & FIBER 2 IN: Connect to HDMI source equipment such as a media player, game console or set-top box. Connect the fiber (paired LC) input to the fiber output from a compatible fiber Transmitter or Transceiver unit.
- 3 CONTROL: Connect directly, or through a network switch, to your PC/laptop to control the unit via Telnet/WebGUI.
- 4 RS-232: Connect, via the provided 9-pin adapter cable, to a PC, laptop or other serial control device to send RS-232 commands to control the unit.
- **5 DC 5V:** Plug the 5V DC power adapter into the unit and connect it to an AC wall outlet for power.



6.3 WebGUI Control

Device Discovery APP

Please obtain the "Device Discovery" software from your authorized dealer and save it in a directory where you can easily find it.

Connect the unit and your PC/Laptop to the same active network and execute the "Device Discovery" software. Click on "Find Devices on Network" and a list of devices connected to the local network will show up indicating their current IP address.

Note: The unit's default IP address is 192.168.1.50.



By clicking on one of the listed devices you will be presented with the network details of that particular device.



- 1) IP Mode: If you choose, you can alter the static IP network settings for the device, or switch the unit into DHCP mode to automatically obtain proper network settings from a local DHCP server. To switch to DHCP mode, please select DHCP from the IP mode drop-down, then click "Save" followed by "Reboot".
- 2) WebGUI Hotkey: Once you are satisfied with the network settings, you may use them to connect via Telnet or WebGUI. The network information window provides a convenient link to launch the WebGUI directly.



WebGUI Control Page

After connecting to the WebGUI's address in a web browser, the login screen will appear. Please enter the appropriate user name and password then click "Submit" to log in.

Note: The default user name and password is "admin".



On the left side of the browser you will see the following menu tabs where all primary functions of the unit (Video, EDID Settings and System Settings) are controllable via the built in WebGUI. The individual functions will be introduced in the following sections.




Clicking the red "Logout" tab will automatically log the currently connected user out of the WebGUI and return to login page.



Video Tab

This tab provides video routing control as well as control over the HDCP behavior and naming of the HDMI Inputs and Output. To assign a new video route, please click the Output button and then click on the button of the preferred Input port to route. As you select each button they will change their color to orange. The new route will become active immediately and the routing information displayed on the buttons will change accordingly.




- 1) Output: Rename the Output by clicking on the edit icon to open the editing window then type in the preferred name for the output. Click on "Save" to confirm and activate any changes made to a name. Clicking on the camera icon will mute or unmute the output.
- 2) Input: Rename or modify the HDCP behavior of either Input by clicking on the appropriate edit icon to open the editing window. Click on "Save" to confirm and activate any changes made to a name. Changes made to the HDCP behavior are applied immediately.
 - **Apple Mode:** Completely disables HDCP support on the input.
 - **Follow In:** HDCP support follows the HDCP mode required by the connected source device.
 - **Follow Out:** HDCP support follows the HDCP mode supported by the connected sinks.



EDID Settings Tab

This tab provides control over the EDID behavior of the unit. There are six internal EDIDs, two customer uploaded EDIDs, and one sink sourced EDID that can be assigned to each input port individually. The sink EDID and both Customer EDIDs are also available for download to the connected PC.



- Customer EDID Settings: Manage the uploadable User EDID content.
 - Save Name: Type the preferred name for the User EDID in the space provided then click "Save Name" to confirm the change.
 - **Download:** Click to download and save the current User EDID as a file (*.bin) on the connected PC.
 - Upload: Click to upload a previously saved EDID file (*.bin) from the connected PC into the User EDID slot.
- Sink EDID Download: Select and save the EDID from a connected display.
 - Drop-down Menu: Select the sink to read an EDID from for download.
 - **Download:** Click to download the EDID from the selected sink as a file (*.bin) to the connected PC.
- EDID Mode: This dropdown controls how EDIDs are assigned to the unit's Inputs.



- **All:** Selecting this will allow the assignment of a single EDID to all Inputs simultaneously.
- **Appoint:** Selecting this allows for a different EDID to be assigned to each Input.
- **4) Set EDID Input Content**: This section provides a way to set the EDID to use with the selected Input.
 - **IN 1:** Click this button to select the HDMI Input and open the EDID Source table for assigning an EDID.
 - **IN 2:** Click this button to select the Fiber Input and open the EDID Source table for assigning an EDID.
 - **EDID Source:** Click the EDID to assign to the selected Input. Once the EDID has been selected, the change will be occur immediately.



System Settings Tab

This tab provides access to control a number of system configuration controls including displaying the unit's serial number, modifying the web access privileges, changing the IP configuration, performing a factory reset, rebooting the system, and updating the firmware.



- 1) Serial Number: Displays the unit's serial number.
- 2) Web User Setting: This section provides A way to change the password for the Administrator account. Click on "Save" to confirm and activate any changes made to these settings.
 - Note: The default password is "admin".
- 3) Network: The IP Address, Netmask and Gateway can be set manually, or DHCP can be enabled for automatic IP Configuration if your local network supports it. Click on "Save" to confirm and activate any changes made to these settings.
 - Note: If the IP address is changed then the IP address required for WebGUI or Telnet access will also change accordingly.
- 4) System
 - **Reboot:** Click this button to reboot the unit.
 - Factory Default: Click this button to reset the unit to the factory default settings.
- **5) Firmware Upgrade:** To update the unit's firmware, click the "Choose File" button to open the file selection window and then select



the firmware update file (*.bin format) located on your local PC. After selecting the file, click the "Upgrade" button to begin the firmware update process. Once the process completes the unit will automatically reboot.

Before attempting to use Telnet control, please ensure that both the unit and the PC are connected to the same active networks.

To Access the Command Line Interface (CLI)	
Windows 7	Click Start , type "cmd" in the search field, and
	press Enter.
Windows XP	Click Start > Run, type "cmd", and press Enter.
Mac OS X	Click Go > Applications > Utilities > Terminal.

Once in the Command Line Interface (CLI) type "telnet" followed by the IP address of the unit (and the port number if it is non-standard) and then hit "Enter". This will connect us to the unit we wish to control. Type "help" to list the available commands. See below for reference.




